# Letter from the **Principal**

Welcome back! It was a great pleasure to welcome all of the students back to the school and particularly to welcome our new families! We gave welcome back assemblies throughout the school, where we reenforced the importance of our Al TARBIYEH acronym and our new ABS Experience Model, which we hope encapsulates all the key experiences of an ABS student IB Learner and Round Square Explorer throughout their time at ABS.

#### **Council of International Schools (CIS)/International Baccalaureate (IB) Synchronised Team Evaluation Visit**

As you will no doubt be aware, ABS hosted the first-ever worldwide CIS

Team Evaluation Visit under the revised international protocol, from Saturday 23 September to Thursday 28 September 2017, with its much tougher standards and requirements. The visit started with a meeting of the 16 IB/CIS evaluators with the whole ABS community, in the presence of HRH Princess Sumaya bint El Hassan, and it was really splendid to see all sections of the ABS community represented for such an important meeting, including representatives of the Board of Trustees, Staff, PTA, Booster Club, Alumni Board and, of course, our wonderful Student Council Members, who gave the Evaluation Team a full tour of the school.

The IB/CIS Evaluation Team spent the following week reviewing the school's Self-study, curriculum documentation, policy handbooks, meeting with the Board of Trustees, Leadership Team, teachers, support staff, parents and students and, of course, visiting lessons, including that of the Principal! There can be no doubt that the Evaluation Team carried out a thorough review of all aspects of the ABS, especially its learning and teaching during this week.

We now await the full reports from both CIS and the IB (for all 4 IB programmes) and, whilst there will certainly be recommendations for development from both reports, which will help us in our journey of continuous school improvement, as mentioned by the CIS Team Chair in the draft feedback to all the school staff at the end of the week, there will also be many more commendations. Indeed, it was highlighted that the school had been meticulous in its production of the CIS Self-study and that the school had exceeded all the requirements for the revised CIS Accreditation protocol, which is praise indeed given the much more demanding requirements of the revised CIS international protocol.

This is a fantastic accolade for the whole ABS community and many congratulations and thanks go to all who made this possible, including the Board of Trustees, staff, parents and especially our wonderful students, who made a fantastic impression throughout the whole week. #### Annual Report 2016-2017

Please refer to our <u>Annual Report</u> for 2016-2017 where we celebrate how successful the last academic year was. In particular, congratulations to all students (and their parents) in Grade 10 last year on their superb IB MYP eAssessments results and also to our Grade 12 graduating class of 2017 (and their parents) on, once again, achieving superb IB Diploma, Courses and Career-related Programme results. The latter results are not just significantly above IB worldwide averages, but are also significantly above our CEM centre predictions from the University of Durham (see later in this newsletter) indicating that our students performed considerably above expectations. We were also delighted with the final confirmed university destinations of our graduating class, confirming, yet again, that an ABS IB education can open the doors to the absolutely most prestigious and competitive tertiary institutions worldwide.

#### Whole School Renovations

As mentioned later in this report, we are absolutely delighted (as are the students) with our facilities that have been renovated this summer.

Our renovated track and field looks wonderful and really gives a bright and uplifting feel to the whole campus, not to mention being a greatly enhanced surface for all our sports activities, including the recently highly successful FCB Escola Football Camp, which was held at the school.

Our Design Technology Department has benefited from a total renovation, transforming this area of the school into one of the best learning and teaching spaces on the whole campus. We are delighted with this renovation and look forward to an official opening of these renovated facilities later in the academic year.

I would like to extend a huge thank you to the Board of Trustees for providing the funds to complete such exciting changes to support our students' physical and creative learning, to our generous donors, including the Booster Club, for their fundraising support and, of course, to our Facilities and Maintenance Team for overseeing the completion, on time, and to such a high standard of two major projects over the summer.

It has certainly been a highly positive and productive start to the new school year!

#### **Facilities Update**

This has been another busy summer for improving and maintaining our facilities. A large number of small projects have been completed together with three large projects: the track, field and stadium; renovation of Design Technology floor and the Photo-Voltaic system (still in progress).

#### **Track, Field and Stadium**

As many of you will have seen, the renovation of the Track, Field and Stadium is now complete. In just 42 days, the old surfaces were removed and then 8000 m2 of FIFA PRO quality artificial turf was laid, together with 6,800 m2 of new rubberised surface for the track and 'D' areas. The lining was completed by a UK specialist who works to IAAF standards. The 1600 new seats were fitted and are numbered for assigned seat events.

The field had its first real test during the FCBEscola Football Camp with the team coaches commenting that it's one of the best fields they've ever held a camp on! We hope that ABS students and community will now enjoy these fantastic new surfaces for many years to come.



#### **Facilities Update**

#### **Design Technology Renovation**

The renovation of the Design Technology area has taken place with a large amount of work being undertaken over the summer vacation. The project is now in its final stages with the functionality of each space being completed.

The area now includes 3 classrooms (previously we had only 2), workshop, computer room, electronics/3D printing room, Lego/robotics room, dedicated rooms for the laser cutter and CNC machines, paint room, staff office, student lounge area and numerous storage areas. The area has been designed to let in as much natural light as possible and to allow high visibility into the department as well as having a proper ventilation and fume extraction system.



#### Photo-Voltaic (PV) System Phase 2

Approval from the Electricity Authority to proceed with the second phase of the PV system was obtained in early August and since then preparation of one of the larger areas (by the top car park) has been in progress. The next stage is to install the steel structures and the panels themselves. This will happen during the remainder of this term with full functionality expected by the end of the term.

**Minor Projects** this summer have included the completion of the shaded walkway outside the Sports Complex, a new classroom in the Additional Educational Needs Department, various safety improvements on campus, improved signage, the installation of three new boilers plus all the routine maintenance and painting that goes on all through the summer period.


#### **Newly Upgraded ABS Website**



In 2016/17, the Wellbeing Team met a number of key annual objectives which served to better facilitate the wellbeing of ABS students. Firstly, the Wellbeing Team used the AL TARBIYEH framework and operationalised this across key areas such as the wellbeing curriculum, Student Council, job descriptions and professional development. Secondly, all academic and support staff received and passed a UK accreditation Safeguarding Course from SafeCIC. Further to this, ABS pioneered the first accredited safeguarding course in Arabic globally, and this course will be offered to other institutions across the arab region. Lastly, the wellbeing curriculum was fully revised and mapped vertically so as to ensure we are meeting the age appropriate needs of students from KG1 through to G12.

This year, the Wellbeing Team, again, has a number of key objectives. Taken from the Wellbeing Development Plan 2016-2019. This year, ABS will be aiming to:

- Ensure all stakeholders are aware of the ABS Student Rights to promote mutual respect and fairness
- Review the ABS Behaviour Management Policy with all stakeholders and to increase awareness of what is expected from staff, students and parents
- Ensure ABS Essential Agreements are working in practice and review awareness and effect
- Implement and operationalise the security checkpoints and various other measures to ensure students' safety around the campus (including the automatic attendance register)
- Achieve 95% attendance and provide accurate attendance records
- Conduct vertical and horizontal review of the Wellbeing curriculum to map links to the UNESCO Global Citizenship rubric, Essential Agreements, AL TARBIYEH, IB Learner Profile, Round Square IDEALS and Approaches to Learning

This is our second best set of results; we are very proud of the fact that this was achieved with the largest graduating class of IB Diploma students in Jordan, a total of 69 students.

In addition to this, we are also very excited to share with you our Class of 2017 value added results. These are produced by the University of Durham at the Centre for Evaluation and Monitoring, UK.


